

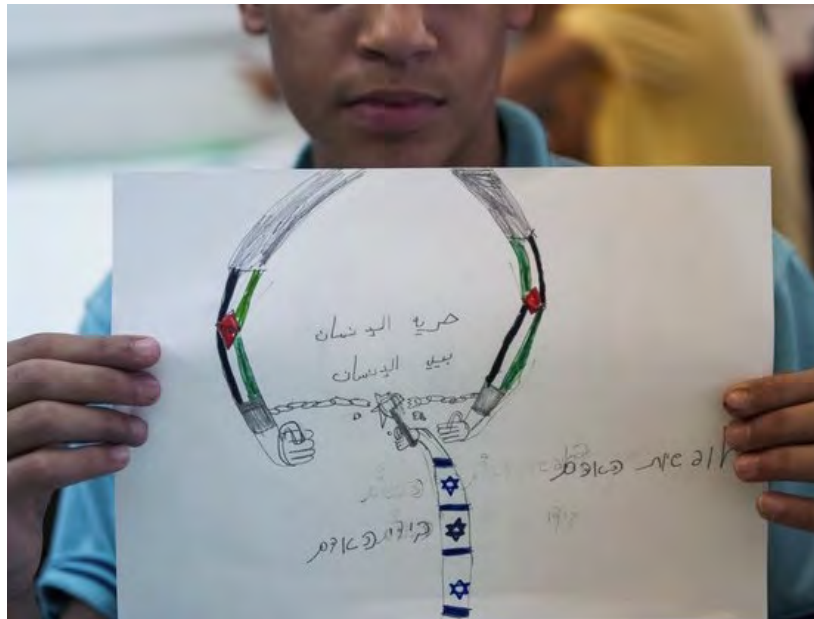

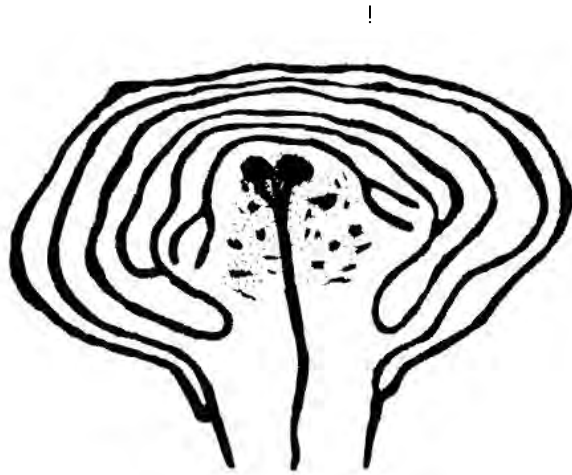

Mémoire de l'Avenir (MDA) – Humanities, Arts and Society (HAS), is a non-partisan, non-religious, non-profit organization that incorporates multidisciplinary competences of scholars, educators and artists working towards a greater knowledge of cultures and of the nature, promoting pacific co-existence, intercultural understanding and exchange beyond political & religious connotations; using the tools of the arts, of patrimonies and dialogue also in education.

Our international network of artists – mediators, lead cultural programs and workshops also in community and cultural centers, in scholarly institutes, in prisons or in extra-curricular actions, locally and internationally.

We are connecting artists, scholars' students and citizens, who both learn to appreciate and attest the richness of individual, cultural and natural diversities and their interdependency.

The educational actions of Mémoire de l'Avenir are based on an original method created by the founder of the association, Margalit Berriet.

This method is the result of many years of local and international experience in the field and of research which has focused on intercultural dialogue. An inclusive and respectful approaches to all cultures, identities, beings and things.

Designed for all types of audiences, it favours an intuitive and sensitive approach to creation. It allows not only to experiment and to develop an individual know-how, but also to experience from individual narratives, the collective dimension of constructing together. These moments of interchange are primarily initiated from the scoop of the workshop, dealing with individual perceptions, memories, identities, pluralism, (hi)stories, uniting ethics and aesthetics at once.

A lack of knowledge of the other is a source of ignorance, producing stereotypes and discrimination.

The roots for the arts in dialogue activities are to use creativity as a source for interchange and collaborations. An open resource for all ages is about sharing knowledge and experiences, and shall incite positive social change towards an inclusive and sustainable development of societies.

EACH ACTION: is tailor-made - led by two artists of different disciplines, with cultural journey of dialogue organised within museum, sites or exhibitions. MDA's research pole as been exploring intuitive and sensitive perception, questioning of the world, springing from nature to cultures. Looking to valorise individual and cultural pluralism, while aiming to also draw parallels, underline similitude similitudes, by using the "etymology" of human expressions as a source to understand the human mind, comprehend universalism and gain respect to all living and things.

Carried out in summer 2003 at the Odenwaldschule Oberhambach.

For 14 days, 28 young people and 7 adults lived, worked and learned together. Out-Come: a monumental sculpture-fountain and mosaic was created as part of building common narratives, questioning (hi)stories, identities, symbolic references, and personal identities.

The Hebrew-Arab group from Israel continues to meet - at the University of Haifa and engaged in the Social Development of the community

The project was funded by SAP AG, the Federal Ministry for Youth and Social Affairs and other donors.

It was awarded the "Democratic Action" prize by the Theodor Heuss Foundation, and the "DEMOCRACIE" price by UNESCO in 2005.

The "fountain monument" is still in place, operating.

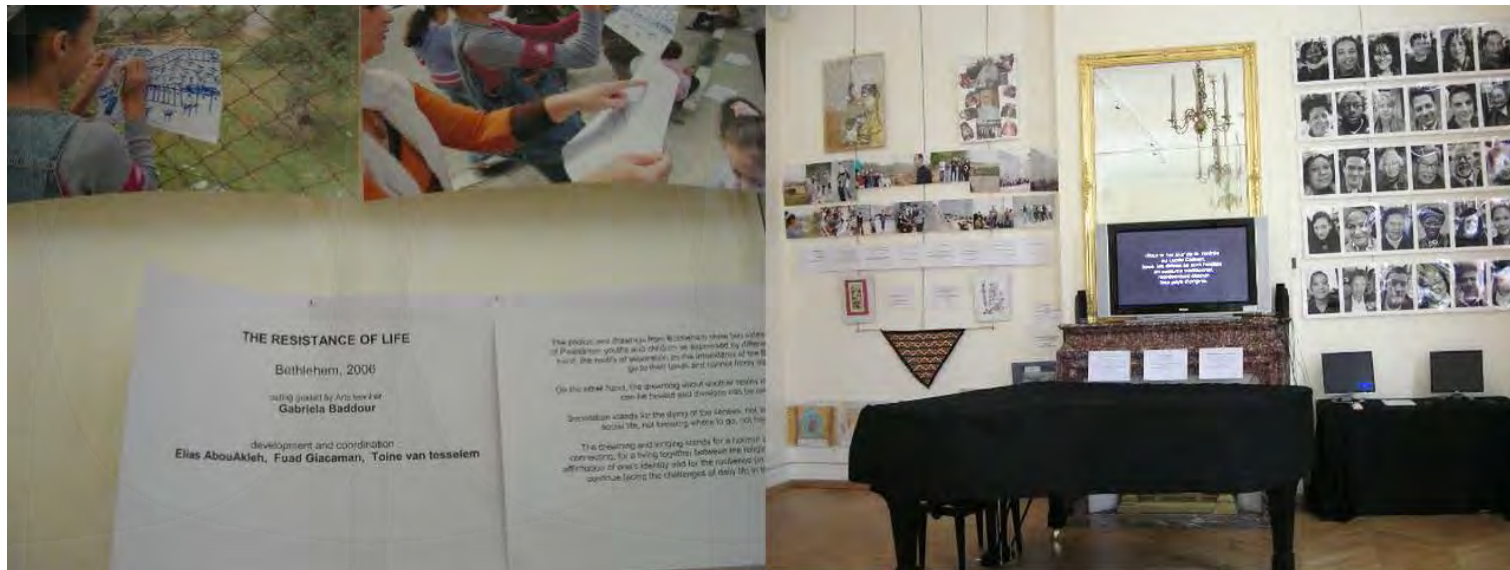

of Palestinian youths and children - expressed by using the intuitive language of symbols. The reality of separation as the inhabitants of the
Bethlehem area cannot go to their lands and cannot freely travel. Next to their dream about another reality in which one's community can be
healed and divisions can be overcome. Separation stands for the dying of the senses, not seeing, not connecting in social life, not knowing
where to go, not having a direction. The dreaming and longing stands for a horizon of hope and peace, for connecting, for a living together
between the religions, and especially for the affirmation of one's identity and for the resilience (in Arabic: *sumud*) needed to continue facing the

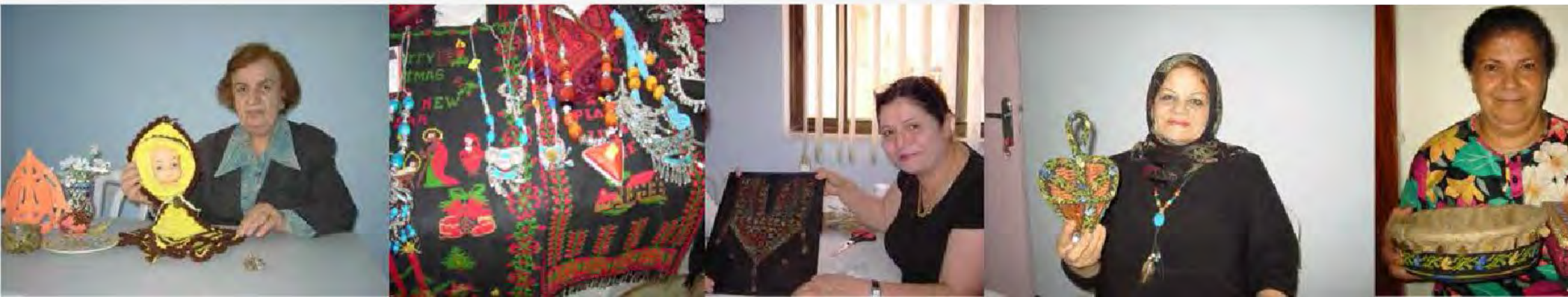

Each woman brought stories related to memories with personal element associated to their identities

The thread of personal (hi)story is complemented by research on the (hi)story of objects, its use in the Palestinian tradition and its presence in other cultures, created a dialogue between Christians, Muslim and Jewish women. Through the manufacturing process of objects and the familiarization with a universal heritage, the present was woven with past and the future, questioning also notion of belonging, property ownership, individual and collective identities.

THE PROJECT consists on meetings in the Goloom School to investigate the possibilities of common creation and interaction between two groups of persons confined to the boundaries of ages the society, yet, living in the same neighbourhood. The project brings together children from an elementary school and retired people from an elderly center nearby. The Goloom elementary School gathers children from various quarters in the south of Tel-Aviv.,



children with obsessive compulsive disorder (OCD), considered by the educational systems as in situation of a « school failure ». The group is correlated with aged persons from the Neve EL'yezer elderly center in the same district. By merging these two groups the project seeks to unite their reflections, expressions and creativity. At the end of the project, an exhibition was organized for both groups and included the community people

PROJECT - « Identity, tradition and modernity» **on the** meaning and the languages of symbols and colours - 36 h shared with 11th and 12th high school students, issue from various cultural and traditional living together in the region of the Galilee (Druze, Muslims, Jews and Christians).The participants are encouraged to question and get to know better the symbols and the symbolism of each culture, folklore and tradition. Using recycled materials, discussions and reflection on the themes of identities, nature, environment resources.



WHERE Eilat, Environmental Centre Eco-dôme, Eilat, In the South of Israel. The geographical situation of Eilat, on the Gulf of the Dead Sea and its proximity to the Jordan, as well as the emphasize of this project on the relation between humans, cultures, and the environment/nature, generate the objective of this project to be correlated with a group working in the same themes and in the neighbour country. Contacts have been started to find a parallel structure in Jordan, for this doubled project, which may see its outcome in a second time.

ARTISTS: Rona Shapira (specialist of environment & ecological art; collaborating with Zeevik Perez « the way of the paper », visual artist), Ornit Goldstein (educator & visual artist), and Roni Doubaï (actor).

PROJECT "Symbol and Identity "workshop, took place in the ecological center Eco-Dome of Eila. Target is a group gifted child. Participants are invited to take part in an « internal voyage » during which they learn how to express themselves on their plural identity; interrogate the relations between human and nature, as well as to discover cultural references and traditions. This « journey » will be paved via an artistic creation, both personal and collective, including corporal expression, and visual art. The use of recycled material will be privileged. The participants will learn to create natural colours (from sand) and work with papier Mache.

PROJECT « Good neighbourhood » mosaic sculpture A mixed group of Arab and Jewish children (6th grade) from two elementary
 The project aims a common thinking, initiation to democratic process, and an artistic creation on the theme of "good neighbourhoods and "sharing" between the two groups of youth, living close each other, yet under apartheid. Creating with mosaics made out of "classic" pieces of ceramics and various personal items, collected by them, creating an environmental three dimensional mosaic sculpture representing a boy and a girl from different nations standing around the globe, each one holding a necklace with a portion of a heart (half) in a position which conveys their goal to find the second half of the heart and combine them into one.

PROJECT "Dialogue of Cultures", in collaboration with the <http://www.aeicenter.org> : Near the Israeli Wall which encircles Rachel's Tomb inside Bethlehem, some 30 women brought together by the Arab Educational Institute are active in a Sumud Story House. Sumud is Arabic for steadfastness, and the purpose of the house is to give Palestinian women, Christian and Moslem, a voice, especially those who live close to the Wall or are directly affected by it. Women are from different social-economic backgrounds, including refugee women. Through artistic activities based on the Palestinian heritage, the women express diversities in Palestinian identity. Using embroidery to photo collages of traditional objects and artistic expressions of memories about the people and the land before the Wall was built. Some of the products will be exhibited in front of the Wall

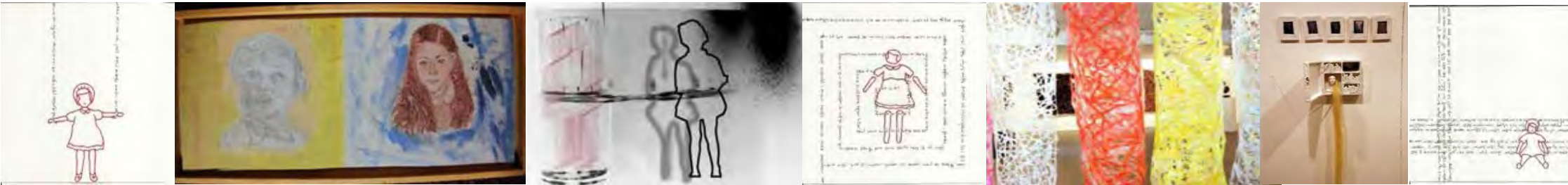

TITLE "Identities" - examined the complexity of this concept, as from an accumulation, preservation and absorption aspects, building plural identities through generations, closely related to the process of memories. The project gathers Arab and Hebrew women, living in the Galilee region and who frequent the Na'amat center in Naharia. The project takes place in the Katzé art Gallery. The workshop aims to create a dialogue between women of the different cultures living together in the Galilee region, yet are segregated from each other. Using persona l narratives, collective (hi)stories, producing poetry and artistic mosaic.



WHERE Dahisha Camp Bethlecheem

THE PROJECT Right of childhood

ARTISTS Rania Akel (artist and activist)And Khaled Zuhair Shaaban Al-Frarja (teacher, community leader)

The composition of the population in the refugee camp has dwindled to about 70% - children. that live in disgraceful conditions and do not have the same opportunities as some other children in the world. The meetings will include discussions and the production of a work. From their day-to-day situation, The project will combine women with lace knowledge to create motifs, heirlooms borrowed from Palestinian folklore.

The project will be partially documented with photographs from the atmosphere of the time and place and will be presented in the presentation as an addition to the works to be performed.

PROJECT with youth at risk, Arab teenagers, in extreme poor conditions, living at the margins of the society, with no family structure, nor homes of their own. They are staying at the Magen Avraham Centre. This project seeks to emphasize the various cultural and religious differences, and the complexities encountered by Muslims and Christians youth. Using visual arts and theatrical expression, the workshop seeks to deal with questions concerning the sentiment of nationality, belongings, the choice of language, and possible future of this youth. Through dialogue, conversation, and creation the participants could reflected and imagine a future, their future.

Workshops of Memory of the Future at the Zorba festival in the desert Ashram at Shitim in the south of Israel April 2017

This festival is held on five days, providing a platform and inspiration for transformation, through an abundance of workshops, therapy sessions, meditations, yoga, art and music.

Draw me who you are

In this workshop we will use symbols and cultural references as tools of knowledge of the self and others. Each participant chooses a symbol that represents himself/herself, connecting to their own feelings, values and identity. We will draw pictures using different symbols we feel represent us and then we will share our creative expressions with the group, enabling all participants to understand that symbols are

intuitive expressions of the human nature experiencing the world, the self and the environment since prehistoric times. We will realize we can “read” and understand various cultures and the plurality of histories and identities. This collective “grammar” of symbols allows us to discover mutual universal values and cross-cultural similarities and diversities. After sharing our own values and identities through our personal symbols, we will make reference to other common cultural symbols such as the Hamza, Snake or Hand, prevalent in many cultures, symbolizing mutual human needs.

Exploring your identity through creative writing

In this workshop we want to enlarge our knowledge of our own identity and culture and also gain a deep understanding for the other and his/her culture and identity, using the Arts to understand the plurality of histories, memories and cultures. Through the method of creative writing we will explore more about our identity. We will do this using the method of short sentences, and in each sentence, we express as

what color, food, symbol, animal or plant we identify and why. After each participant developed more awareness of their own feelings, thoughts and culture, we will share in the group the different texts we wrote in order to gain more understanding of cultural similarities and differences between the group members.
