Memory of the Future is a non-partisan, non-religious, non-profit organisation that incorporates multidisciplinary competences of scholars, educators and artists working towards a greater knowledge of cultures, promoting pacific co-existence and intercultural understanding and exchange beyond political & religious connotations, via the tools of art and education. Our international network of mediators leads cultural programs and workshops in schools, extracurricular and social centers, in France, Germany, Israel, Palestinians territories and Senegal, connecting students and citizens, who both learn to appreciate and attest the richness of cultural diversity.

MOF's programs aim to formulate and contribute, in the spirit of **respect and reconciliation**, to new outlooks for **young & older generations**, confronted each day with **questions of identity**, **acceptance and transmission** of one's idiosyncratic cultural identity. Seeking to transcend habitual references and ways of thinking, the various programs propose an interactive dialogue between identities, which can be appreciated in museums, architecture, the surrounding, and an artistic activity both personal and collective as means of expression, communication, comprehension.

Exchange artwork - An international and educational artist network working in schools, social centers, cultural centers...exchanging Internet messages and images of artwork projects between students from Paris, Germany, Israel and Palestine & Senegal.

Events – Organization of artistic events uniting together the artwork of artists or people from Palestine - Israel and Europe.

Resources - Begun 3 years ago, MOF research has been exploring the many cultures of our civilization and their specificities from as far back as the Neolithic age, drawing parallels, similarities and differences between them. The use of symbolism is applied as the "etymology" of all human expression.

Approximately 200 beneficiaries each year: children, teenagers, students, women and retired attending associations.

Depending on the project, MOF develop projects with participants of different ages (from pre-school to retired women), faiths (Jewish, Muslim, Christian, Druze) or backgrounds (Arab, Hebraic, Bedouins), from all communities, most living in conflict situation and/or from a disadvantaged background.

Exchanging ideas about issues that affect them and taking part in an artistic project make them realize that they are able to complete a project, to create something interesting and share their knowledge.

Goals & Objectives

Memory of the Future seeks to question experience of participants of various backgrounds and cultures. What are their representations of the culture of the "other"? What are the similitudes among their differences? Which place do they have in their family, their community, their society? What are the specific cultural practices that they keep in memory?

- Creating bonds between cultural, social, religious differences by promoting people to people dialogue and opening cross-cultural communication, aiming to live together in respect in a multicultural dimension, Preventing from stereotypes, discrimination and all forms of racism by giving the tools to understand diversity and complementarities of cultures, - Approaching the practice of the arts and creative means as a way of opening the dialogue and a tool for social interactions. - Helping participants to regain self-confidence by understanding their own culture and to respect others by discovering that they share more than they thought.

Mediators' training

Memory of the Future offers practical training designed for Artists, educators and social mediators taking part in educational or management programs. As they interact with young or older generations, educators and leaders must acquire meaningful and constructive tools to provide answers to the questions of identity, acceptance, and transmission of cultural identities, respect among differences & increase creativity. Art and artistic production (both within school and extracurricular programs) have proven very effective in promoting intercultural understanding, recognition of universal values, while encouraging self-expression and confidence.

The trainings enable participants:

- to approach questions related to intolerance, exclusion, discrimination,
- to promote the understanding of the diversity and universality of cultures
- to encourage and facilitate dialogue, self-expression & creativity.

The training also endows educators to design original ways to visit museums, art exhibitions or historical or architectural sites which do not call for extensive prior background in Art history (of the educators or their audience). The approach developed aims at discovering the language of the arts as mirror of humanity, its history, its ways to build society and transmit ideas, roles, and built its patrimonies.

Women/ "Time Table" - Cycle 2 Project

- o **Description**: Time Table = Agenda, a play of words on "Time around the table". Eating, ceremonies, holidays, cooking are conditioned by the season and type of agriculture available. Memory of the Future's workshops at the Qatar Leadership Conference

<u>Workshop 1:</u> Art as a tool for dialogue among diversities MOF's workshops aim to fight stereotype, violence and conflict with all forms of artistic expressions:

Art is a privileged medium that allows overcoming linguistic, religious and political borders, and offers an original grid of lecture of society, at time universal, while facilitating questions on plural identities and diversities.

This workshop explored how exactly art can be used as a tool of dialogue to bridge between all kinds of differences (male-female, Muslim-Jewish etc.) and will enable the participants to use these unique methods for facilitation in their own societies.

Workshop 2: Art as the language of shared humanity

The languages of arts and symbols are ideal tools in order to recognize mutual values, as well as to reinforce one's own individuality and appreciation of our differences: Symbolic representations and metaphors are the trace and reflection of humanity. Mysterious as they can be, symbols are powerful tools of communication, both universal and individual.

Participants learned to read and understand a repertoire of cultural references and symbols which they incorporate in their acceptance of diversities.

They explored their own cultural references, share them with the other group members and realize they can "read" and understand various cultures.

This collective "grammar" of symbols allows them to discover mutual universal values, and cross-cultural similarities and diversities.

November 2015 to Mars 2016

This project created a common platform of exchange and creativity among two hundred high school students. The students explore the different ways each perceives and produces memories, histories, knowledge and references.

The project consists on meetings in the **Golomb School** from January to April 2009.

The aim of this workshop is to investigate the possibilities of common creation and interaction between two categories of persons in the boundaries of the society, living in the same neighborhood.

The project brings together children from an elementary school and retired people from an elderly center nearby.

The Golomb elementary School gathers children from various quarters in the south of Tel-Aviv. The chosen group is composed of 12 6th grade children with obsessive compulsive disorder (OCD), considered by the educational systems as in « school failure ».

The group is correlated with 6 with aged persons from the **Neve EL'yezer** elderly center located in the same neighborhood.

By merging these two groups the project seeks to unite their reflections, expressions and creativities.

At the end of the project, an exhibition will be organized at the school, to which the young and the old are invited to bring members of their families and friends

The project run at the school, from February to May 2009 - 10 to 12 meetings of about 3 hours each.

15 high school students in 11th and 12th grade, come from different existing cultural and traditional backgrounds in the region of the Galilee (Druze, Muslims, and Christians).

Using recycled materials, each participant will create an abstract "identity-mask", to which he/she will integrate both personal and cultural symbols and signs. Including discussions and reflection on the themes of identity, nature, environment resources; collection of recycled material for the creation of masks; the youth worked on the expression of one's identity via an artistic creation.

The group will take active part in the updating of the common blog of « Memory of the Future" international workshops (France, Germany and Turkey).

The workshop takes place in the ecological center Eco-Dome of Eilat. The public target is a group of 15 gifted children. The project has started in January and will end at the end of Mav.

Participants are invited to take part in an « internal voyage » during which they learn how to express themselves on their identity; interrogate the relations between man and nature, as well as to discover cross cultural symbols.

This « journey » will be paved via an artistic creation, both personal and collective, including corporal expression, and visual art. The use of recycled material will be privileged. The participants will learn to create natural colors (from sand) and work with paper Mache.

Each participant will create a figure from waste material and papier mâché, The figure should include both a "personal symbol" (related to his family, culture, place of birth...), and a "universal symbol" which expresses the relation between people of different cultures, religions, backgrounds, or other common values such as the strong bond of man to his environment.

Each figure will be accompanied by a personal text. The different figures will be "staged" by the participants and assembled into a common work/design which will henceforth symbolizes the collective identity of the group and convey a universal message/symbol that they wish to transmit. The workshop includes indoor work, projection of slide shows on various themes related to the project (creativity with papier mâché; survey on symbols, religions and every day life of various cultures and in different times); a visit in a museum/art gallery in the region; an excursion in the desert to collect sand for the creation of their own natural colours.

The geographical situation of Eilat, on the Golf of the Dead Sea and its proximity to the Jordan, as well as the emphasize of this project on the relation between humans, cultures, and the environment/nature, generate the objective of this project to be correlated with a group working in the same themes and in the neighbour country. Contacts have been started to find a parallel structure in Jordan, for this doubled project, which may see its outcome in a second time.

two groups of 10 children in the 6th grade from two elementary schools, Jewish and Arab, situated in two neighbor towns.

The project consists meetings between January to April 2009.

The project aims a common thinking, initiation to democratic process, and an artistic creation on the theme of "good neighborhoods and "sharing" between the two groups of Arab and Jewish children living close each other.

Creating with mosaics made out not only of "classic" pieces of ceramics but also of various materials collected by the children and fragments of personal objects: an environmental three dimensional mosaic sculpture representing a boy and a girl from different nations standing around the globe, each one holding a necklace with a portion of a heart (half) in a position which conveys their goal to find the second half of the heart and combine them into one.

Each group will first work separately on the creation of the different figures and scenery around the globe, putting into it bits and pieces of their own flavors symbols, "identity"... before meeting the other group and completing the sculpture together.

The sculpture will thus convey both a collective symbolic message, and the individual expression of each member of the group, such a mosaic, build out of various little separate stones.



Conceived in such a way that it can be divided into two, each part will be placed in each of the two schools, completed by it's second half presented in a photograph. Therefore, both parts will be linked in yet another dimension, connecting memories, present and future

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Near the Israeli Wall which encircles Rachel's Tomb inside Bethlehem, some 30 women brought together by the Arab Educational Institute are active in a Sumud Story House. Sumud is Arabic for steadfastness, and the purpose of the house is to give Palestinian women, Christian and Moslem, a voice, especially those who live close to the Wall or are directly affected by it.

The women are from different social-economic backgrounds, including refugee women. Through artistic activities based on the Palestinian heritage, the women express the diversity in their lives within the overall joint Palestinian identity. The activities range from embroidery to photo collages of traditional objects and artistic expressions of memories about the people and the land before the Wall was built. Some of the products will be exhibited in front of the Wall

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

Workshop held in the artist's studio in Tel-Aviv, from September 2008 to April 2009;

The 2009 identity workshop examined the complexity of the concept, mainly perceived as an accumulation, preservation and absorption of identities through generations, and closely related to the process of memory. The seven women, who took place in the project, from 40 to 75 years old, are artists who have accomplished themselves both as women and artists.

On this background, the workshop sought to examine inner conflicts. Each encounter included an artistic discourse based on literary and philosophical texts as well as poems related to these conflicts.

The women will encounter the Israeli Arab ladies from Hum el Fahem, in April,



 "Society, women artists and artists women" workshops in Um El Fahem, lead by visual artist, writer, art teacher and feminist activist Aida Nasrallah

The workshops take place in Um El Fahm (at homes and the artists Gallery) from January to Mai 2009.

Aida Nasrallah worked with 3 small groups of women artists and amateurs, of various art skills and practices: from traditional Palestinian, knowhow of arts and crafts, sculpture and embroidery, passing through paintings, photography and modern techniques such as multimedia, instillations, performance...

The women, all from the Um El Fahem district are Arab, Christians and Muslims. There is also a dual work Aida directs in parallel with an Israeli Jewish artist.

The main goal of these workshops is to assist the women in their reflection on building their future, their ambitions, as well as in their fight against prejudices, via the arts and therefore weave human connections beyond community and cultural borders.

The main emphasis of this project is the emergence of feminism in the arts within the Palestinian contemporary society, which is closely related to the socio political changes in this society as well as in the contemporary society in general.

It thus aims to strengthen both the links between the local and international scene, and the interaction between artists and art social scenes. These workshops also seek to interrogate social and cultural issues related to the participant's history and environment, and to the extent of openness and tolerance of the Palestinian society.

By taking active part in the debate over social values, the art work and engagement of the participants demonstrate the values of collaboration, empowerment, consciousness-raising, and belief in art's ability to create a change.

Beyond the individual works, the participants will works on the creation of a common dress of up to 30 meters long, a patchwork of their various identities.

In collaboration with the art Gallery Katzé (The Edge)2, and the women organization Na'amat3 (Naharyia; Mazraa;Lazar)

The project gathers a dozen of women, Arab and Hebrew living in the Galilee region and who frequent the Na'amat center in Naharia. The project takes place in the Katzé art Gallery between once and twice a month from January to April 2009. The workshop aims to create a dialogue between women of different cultures living in the Galilee region, via their stories, history, writings and artistic mosaic creation.

Each participant was to choose a personality (fictitious or real) whom she cherished and who was decisive to her life. Guided by the artists, each woman conveyed the story of the personality she chose in a poetic way, and created a portrait of the "one her heart loves" out of mosaic, an old traditional technique, for the three religions practiced in the Galilee. The portraits will be assembled to a collective image, thus made of a mosaic of stories and identities. The results of the workshop will be exposed in the Katzé

by it. The women are from different social-economic backgrounds, including refugee women. Through artistic activities based on the Palestinian heritage, the women will express the diversity in their lives within the overall joint Palestinian identity. The activities range from embroidery to photo collages of traditional objects and artistic expressions of memories about the people and the land before the Wall was built. Some of the products will be exhibited in front of the Wall.

• ► TEL AVIV "My dress/prayer" identity women workshop, Jaffa

Leading artist: Ziv Peleg Ben Zeev -

The workshop takes place in the artist's studio between October 2008 to April 2009.

The participants of the workshop this year were five Jewish and Christian women, living in Jaffa, in a mixed neighborhood of Jews, Christians and Muslims

The women are mothers of children who study in the same school. None of the women has any artistic background or education. The goal of the project was to convert the concept of identity into an object and thus examine it indirectly. The women learnt various ways of expression in art, such as choosing and playing around with materials and colors; developing an artistic discourse on art; and finally, the creation of their own artistic work in relation to two personal aspects: a dress and a "prayer". Each woman wrote her "prayer", which she then transformed in an artistic way – calligraphically – to her work. At a second stage, the group created its collective "prayer". A part from the various artworks, a video film was edited, which will be presented at the final exhibition in France. The video shows each participant presenting herself and her work, as well as their reading of the collective prayer. During the months of the workshop the women got to know each other and got closer. Each session provided the participants with a moment of rest – physical and mental –from the worries of the day. It is important to underline that the workshop (started in October 2008) continued during the difficult period of the war in Gaza, in which some intensive and sensitive issues were brought to the meetings, conducted and immersed into the artistic creation




IDENTITE FEMININE

The workshop was asked about the theme of identity, seen as an accumulation ofidentities, including those of past generations in connection with the work of memory.

The seven participants, aged between 40 and 75, are all artists who are accomplished in their lifetime. During the eight monthly meetings, has been developed an artistic, literary, poetic and philosophical conflicts for analyzing art. These exchanges have led to new ideas, which were subsequently close the topic of the workshop. The exhibition presents the results of the workshop, which was able to meet the objectives of both individual and social, while developing knowledge and acceptance of others as individuals and as an artist.








« A cultural Dialogue » Magen Avraham Centre, Jaffa

The project takes place at <u>the Magen Avraham centre for youth at risk</u>, from January to April 2009.

The adolescents (14 to 18 years old) who frequent the Magen Avraham Centre are Arab teenagers, in extreme poor conditions, living at the margins of the society, with no family structure, nor homes of their own.

This project seeks to emphasize the various cultural and religious differences and complexities encountered by Muslims and Christians Arabs in Israel. Via an artistic creation and consideration, both visual arts and theatrical expression, the workshop seeks to deal with questions concerning the sentiment of nationality, feelings of belongings, the choice of language, and possible future of this youth. Through dialogue, conversation, and an artistic creation, the participants are thus lead to formulate, in a different way, society issues which preoccupy youth in general and their specific social, economic milieu in particular.

2nd group: women (some of whom are the mothers of the participants) who all live in the Daheishe refugee camp.

The 10 sessions of the project take place in the camp from January to April 2009. The refugees of Daheishe are all displaced people, most of who were forced to leave their homes in the surrounding of Jerusalem in 1948. In different ways, they have maintained the identity of their home villages, throughout their life in the camp. 60% of the population of the camp is children. Life conditions in the camp are hard and elementary rights of children are not assured. The rights of children as well as every day and family life in the camp are the issues and themes for the artistic creation of the workshop. Women, mainly mothers, who conserved the practice of Palestinian traditional embroidery intervene with the group of adolescents transmitting their know-how, thus creating an artistic and inter generation dialogue. "Little children you carry in your hands, big children you carry on your heart", wrote Judith Rotem in her book "I Loved so Much". This exhibition examines with great sensitivity the place of the child in society and at the same time tries to find the child hidden within us. Many factors, direct and indirect, influence and leave their mark in the child's early and critical years. Cultural and traditional influences, socio-economical status, family priorities, lack of cooperation between the various governmental agencies, discrimination in budget allocation and lack of direct parental involvement in the relevant systems... These factors, whether they exist or not, affect the unique pattern in which a child's image is shaped. The awkward clothing imposed strict behavioral rules regarding children's body language, which unlike adult body language, is much more casual. This lack of consideration for children's universe & needs changed over the years and children's clothes changed as well and were adjusted to their needs. Many funding, means, awareness and knowledge are currently established and invested, all over the world, to support children in the crucial years of their development into mature adults. The artists, participating in this exhibition, try to express this delicate matter as a fragile world that tends to crack and break down whenever the watchful eye is not looking even for a brief moment. Association Bat-Chen, KITES FOR FREEDOM, (Arts Plastiques), Bat-Chen was born on Purim, March 19th, 1981. She was born in Raanana. She lived in Ra'anana until she was four years old after which she moved with her family to Kibbutz Kfar Aza. When she was 6, the family relocated to Tel Mond, where she began elementary school and first grade. When she was in fourth grade, at the age of 10, she began writing her first diary as a result of the outbreak of the Golf War. It was a very frightening time for her and her teacher suggested that the children keep a diary to record their reactions, feelings and anxieties which appeared as a result of the war. She even entitled this diary, "The War Diary." Her parents never knew that she was even keeping a diary!!

Only after she was killed, did they find these treasures. They found four diaries in all. In this project, children from Israel and Palestine made kites for peace and freedon, they draw and wrote on them, working around Hebrew and Arabic similar words. At the end, they went at the

The project's main goal is to promote active participation of women who are vulnerable and suffer from a process of social exclusion and marginalization in the conflict zones. Through the gaining of self-awareness and awareness of the other, as well as technique training, the project aims to promote the creation of micro-projects. It will contribute to the development of the participants' capacities and promote a will to exchange elements of their culture, cross narrative stories by leaving a trace of their family's & individual memories.

The participants will work on creating a cookbook. The cookbook will include recipes of dishes (first courses, main courses and desserts), tells about habits & traditions from the Jewish and Arab traditions. Each participant will chose dishes that she particularly likes and that were transmitted to her by her grandmother, mother, aunt, sister... The dishes will be prepared and photographed by each participant. The recipes will be handwritten in Hebrew and Arabic (and translated to English). Moreover the written recipes and the photos, the book will also contain drawings of traditional motifs, symbols that relate to the participants' cultures, photos of handmade plates, etc.
